Curriculum Overview Autumn Term 1 2018 Year 4



English

This half term we will be reading '*Romans on the rampage*' by *Jeremy Strong*.

We will compare and contrast Roman times with how we live now and learn to use and apply the writing skills needed to produce some amazing writing including narrative pieces and our very own Roman soldier diaries.
